
Dakota Dog Park NOTES

Many have noticed that the water fountains at Dakota are running constantly. (I've also seen this at Hockinson Meadows Community Park near Kane.) The county assured me this was done on purpose to keep the pipes from freezing. So all is well. Thank you for calling it to our attention. On a sad note, we had a tragic loss at Dakota in December 2020. A precious chihuahua named Bandit passed away after an accidental encounter with another larger dog. All parties involved are understandably upset. Our hearts go out to everyone involved, especially Bandit's family. This happened near the west gate. I am in talks with the county to see if the small dog park can be configured for access without going through the main park. In the meantime, you can help by not lingering near the gates, even though that is where the water fountains are, and for monitoring your dogs when entering or leaving the park, especially when there is a mix of large and small dogs.
